1. Phonics

Phoneme detectives - the /oa/ phoneme family

Download the 3 sheets from our Y1 page and explore this phoneme family:

- a) 'oa phoneme family worksheet' - look at the different spelling choices (graphemes) for the sound (phoneme) /oa/.
- b) 'oa phoneme family story' - underline all the words containing the phoneme /oa/ and write in the relevant column on sheet a.

- c) 'oa phoneme family - alternative spellings, word ideas' - find more words to add to sheet a.

4. Reading

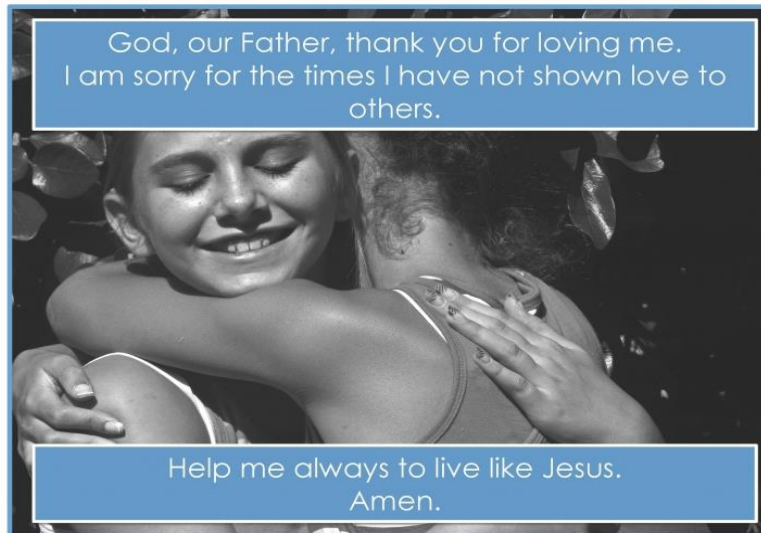
Read your books from school for at least 10 minutes each day or any books, comics, magazines or papers of your choice.

RE

Sometimes we quarrel with each other and have arguments, it is important to say sorry and to forgive others when they say sorry to us. God always forgives us when we are sorry.

Using the picture above, talk about the following questions:

- What do you see in the picture?
- What do you think has happened?
- What are the children saying to each other?
- How do you think the children are feeling?
- Why is it sometimes hard to say sorry?
- Who might help you?

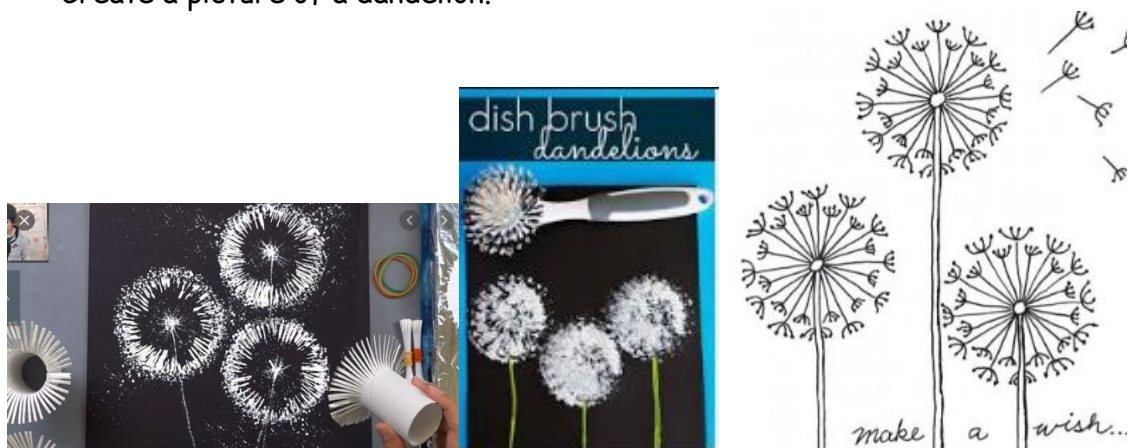
Choose from the following activities:

- Using the storyboard sheet (attached on the year 1 page) in the first box draw a picture to show something you could have done wrong, in the second box draw a picture to show how you could make this better, in the third box draw a picture to show everything is resolved. You could add speech bubbles to your pictures or use the boxes below to explain what is happening.

Science - Plants
