- **Literacy for this week:**

Phonics-

1. Try <https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/>

This site is free for now and the username is 'march20' and the password is 'home'.

Try the activities in Phase 5 and 6.

2. You could also go on Twinkl Parents Hub, English and look at the activities and PowerPoints for Phonics Phase 6.

Writing-

1. This week we will focus on 'Homophones'. These are words that sound the same but are sometimes spelt differently and mean different things.

I have attached some worksheets from the Twinkl website for you to download and complete. Sentences can be written in your blue books.

2. This week the focus is non-fiction writing and reading. We will be learning about a famous lady called Amelia Earhart. There is information about her for you to read and a PowerPoint to look at, some sheets to complete and then you could write a report in your blue books about everything you have learnt about her.

Reading-

1. Read any book, magazine or comic for at least 10 minutes each day.
2. Read the reading comprehension that is attached. It is all about Amelia Earhart. There are three differentiated sheets attached.
3. Don't forget you can also use Reading Eggs. Your password should be at the back of your Reading Diary.

- **Maths for this week**

1. Essential mental maths skills that should be practised daily:
Addition and subtraction of numbers to 20.
Multiplication and division facts for 10, 5, 2 and then 3.
Odd and even numbers to 100.
Doubles and halves to 20.
Number bonds to 10, 20 and 100 (in tens).
