Parents Consultations – Book Appointment Using MyEd



Parents evening is taking place on Tuesday 5th and Wednesday 6th

October. Please take a moment to book an appointment using the MyEd app. If you find a problem doing this, please come to the school office where we will try our best to help you.

The timings are based on a 24-hour clock so 13:30 is 1:30pm. Please be aware of this when booking.

We are inviting one parent per child in for the consultation meeting, which will be held in the school hall. We request that you wear a mask for the duration of time that you are in school.

Please only arrive in school 5 minutes before your meeting. If you are early, you will be asked to wait outside to ensure we maintain social distancing in the hall.

Challenging times!

With the lorry driver shortage and now oil issues, unfortunately we face challenges we could never have imagined in what continues to be uncertain times.

Aspens have asked me to make you aware that they foresee the possibility of some supply issues regarding the food they provide for school dinners, especially because they rely on cooking food from fresh.

This may mean that your child will be asked to choose an alternative dinner to that which you have ordered when they arrive at school. Aspens promise to keep any such disruption to a minimum and I assure you that if you have booked a meal for your child, I promise they will receive a meal they are happy with.

School dinners

Please make sure you complete the weekly menu selection with your child. Children are sometimes saying that they do not like the choice selected for them.

Also, please be aware of your child's allergies and how they are recorded in school. E.g. A cheese sandwich should not be selected for a child registered with a dairy allergy.

We are trying to encourage children to eat using a knife and fork. Children young and old, throughout the school, need to practice this skill, starting by holding the utensils correctly. Please support your child at home if required.

Harvest Celebrations

CAFOD are asking, on Family Fast Day – Friday 1st October, that we 'Go Green and Give'. We plan to raise money later in the year for CAFOD. However, we invite children on Friday to 'Go Green' as much as possible by:



- Walking, scootering or cycling to school
- Reducing plastic used in packed lunches
- Only use the water needed turn taps off once finished with
- Turn lights off when they aren't needed... and so on.



Children are encouraged to wear green on Friday – or any colours that represent the Harvest and God's creation (non-uniform). The brighter the better. In return we will be collecting for two local causes. **Please bring in cans of food, packets of rice, pasta, tinned food and vegetables,**

biscuits... anything that will keep well. These will be taken to the local food bank that supported many of our families throughout this pandemic.

Father David has asked that we support new Mums with young babies. Families are struggling to afford nappies, baby wipes, shampoo and other baby essentials. Any donations will be passed on to a group St Mary's and St. Paul's churches are supporting.
