# Attendance and Punctuality

Every child should attend school each day if at all possible. Please support us by ensuring your child is in school by 8:50am, so they can enter class on time. The school gate will be locked each day at 8:55am. If your child arrives late, you must sign them in at the school office. **They should not enter school alone.** 

We are so pleased to see families gather to chat and catch up on the playground once again. I hope you feel just as happy now this opportunity has returned. Some people feel comfortable continuing to wear a mask. Please respect their wishes and give each other space. If you are named as a 'close contact', we request that you do wear a mask on the school site, to protect other families.

# MyEd and +Pay

Goodness, the new communication and pay system we have adopted has come with its challenges! Thank you for your



patience. For those of you who have a computing interest, we are experiencing disconnections between our server and MyEd which means the two intermittently stop communicating with each other. Now we are aware of the issue, we are monitoring it closely.

Please try to log on to MyEd via the app this evening if posisble. A few important tips to keep in mind:

- Download the app and wait 24 hours before attempting to log in.
- If you experience an error, delete the app and reload it, before trying again.

Anyone struggling with the app is encouraged to contact school or pop in to the school office on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> September when Mrs Webb will be available to support you.

From Monday 13<sup>th</sup> September, all school dinner orders must be placed through the app. If you do not order a meal via the app, it will be assumed that your child is having a packed lunch - provided from home.

Again, I thank you for your patience with this transition.

It is a kind tradition that children bring sweets for their class when it is their birthday. **This is not expected at all**. But please, if doing so, a small bag of sweets is plenty. No party bags - this is too much!
