Attendance

Did you know...?

A total of 6 days off (authorised)
over the year will achieve an
attendance of approximately 96.8%
This means that if your child takes
6 school days off for a holiday in a
year, any further sickness absence
will mean they cannot reach an
acceptable attendance and there
learning is significantly impacted.

Attendance and Punctuality

Improving attendance and punctuality is a priority for St Mary's school this year. In my September newsletter I wrote about attendance and punctuality and I asked for your support. Again, I'd like to remind you of the importance that your child attends school if at all possible, every day. Letters have been sent (last week) to those families where attendance and lateness already presents a concern; based on September and October data. Where letters have been received, please work with me to improve your child's learning journey this year.

St Mary's has always been proud of a high attendance and as we consider a post-COVID world, we must strive to return to a respectful 97% attendance – our school average in past years.

Attendance Matters

Please know that:

- Holidays taken during school time are not acceptable and fines are likely.
- Adding a day on to a half term holiday is not permitted flights are rarely rescheduled. These
 absences will be unauthorised.
- Taking time off school for medical appointments that can be made outside of school hours are not encouraged. Book appointments in advance, out of school hours.

Lateness

The school gate opens at 8:40am and children should be on the playground **ready for the school bell at 8:50am**. Several families are regularly running through the gate **at** 8:50pm or entering after the bell. Please plan your morning so you leave home 5 minutes earlier if this is the case. Regularly, people report 'transport issues' as a reason when it is instead the usual heavy traffic causing delays. It is not a good feeling for anyone, especially a child, to arrive late. It causes discomfort at the start of the day. Please support your child by modelling positive lifestyle habits.
