
Dear Parents and Carers,

## Nursery – late entry

Arriving late to school is not a good feeling for a child. It creates uncertainty and unease, at the start of their day. There are a regular number of parents/children running in to the playground after the bell has gone. At this point, your child is late as they are not on school grounds for 8:50am. Leaving home 5–10 minutes earlier will prevent this lateness, in many cases. Please adjust your morning routine to allow plenty of time so your child is punctual - on the playground with their peers **before** the school bell.

If you are bringing your child late to Nursery, parents/carers must come to **the main school office** to sign in. After signing in, you will be directed to take your child around to Nursery and wait to be let in. Nursery staff are regularly being distracted from teaching as they are welcoming late comers. This is causing a disruption to the Nursery setting. Please can I ask that parents/carers do their very best to be punctual. This is an important life skill and positive habit for you and your child to live by from this school early age.
