Year 6 mobile phones in school

Year 6 children will no longer be allowed to bring their mobile phones in to school as of **Tuesday 6th June**. This is mainly due to some safeguarding concerns that have arisen over the last half term. However, children have never been encouraged or allowed to bring their phones in to school, to support them on their journey, unless in unprecedented circumstances. School expectations have not changed and we ask you to support us with this.

Our main feeder school, The Trinity Catholic School, is firm about children having no access to mobile phones — to, from and during school. We are talking to your children regularly about being 'secondary ready'. Accepting such rules is one aspect of this preparation. Any phone brought into school will be retained by the school office, ready for a parent / carer to collect. Children must not bring their mobile phone in their school bag. I ask parents to support school by ensuring your child's mobile phone remains at home, please.
