Reading – It is important that your child continues to read at home and we are encouraging the children to do this for a little longer now they are reading much longer books so that they do not lose interest in their books.

Maths - Please also ensure your child is practising their times tables facts up to 12x12 and the related division facts that go with these e.g. 6x3=18 so $18\div 6=3$. You could also support your child this half term by helping them to learn the prime numbers to 100. Any number that is only divisible by 1 and itself without remainders is known as a prime number.

The prime numbers from 1 to 100 are: 2, 3, 5, 7, 11, 13, 17, 19, 23, 29, 31, 37, 41, 43, 47, 53, 59, 61, 67, 71, 73, 79, 83, 89, 97.

Please encourage children to get into a good routine completing their work at a time that suits your family, and bring it in as soon as it is all completed.
