This half term is always a busy one with the curriculum and the exciting preparations for Christmas. Please see below for the areas of the curriculum your child will be learning about this half term.

<b>English</b> We will work on transcription, composition, grammar and punctuation through a range of text types such as diary writing, persuasive writing, narrative and non-fiction. Stimuli will come from a range of film, books and speaking and listening activities with some links to our History and Science topics above. Specific handwriting sessions will take place weekly. <b>Maths</b> The areas covered this term are: multiplication and fractions. Times tables and arithmetic tests will be carried out regularly. The children are expected to know all times tables up to 12x12. This really helps them with multiplication tasks. <b>Science</b> The topic this term is 'Changing Materials'. The Lessons will focus on reversible and irreversible changes. We will be looking into the weird and wonderful world of Heston Blumenthal's creations! <b>Music</b> The children are continuing to play their chosen instrument. The focus this half term is on dynamics - what this means and how they affect the style of music being listened to or played.		Dynamics Fast Slow

<b>DT</b> We will be investigating, designing, building and evaluating CAM toys. The children will be designing and building a moving, pop-up toy. Winter kit: navy jogging bottoms, white t-shirt, school jumper or navy jogging top.

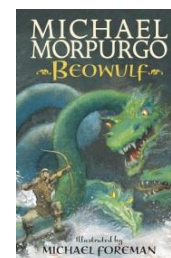
