Art – Hannah Höch Photomontage <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Höch was one of the key artists who started an art form called photomontage. • Photomontage is a type of collaging where images that already exist are cut up and rearranged to make a new image. • She believed that art was something that was supposed to change society and make it better e.g. change regarding sexism • Höch made art that examined why some people are thought of as more beautiful than others, especially in the media.
