Title: What lives in our garden?

Communication and Language

• Sing Nursery Rhymes: Jack and Jill, Incy Wincy Spider, 5 Little Speckled Frogs, Mary, Mary Quite Contrary

Listen, understand and talk about:

- The life cycle of plants (sunflowers/vegetables)
- The life cycle of a caterpillar
- Minibeasts and how they are good for our garden
- Listening to and responding to instructions

Personal, Social and Emotional Development (including RSHE)

- Selecting resources and achieving an end goal: Linked to joining materials (minibeasts)
- Talking to unfamiliar people in new situations F2 Teachers
- Exploring the feelings of our self and our peers
- RSHE: Ready Teddy Making good, healthy lifestyle decisions about diet
- Responsibility: Caring for plants and minibeasts
- Playing partnering to support two-way play

Physical Development

- Name writing practise
- Large scale arm movements, using chunky chalks, pom-poms, large scale painting and waterplay
- Tool safety: Cutting by making snips and cutting straight lines and using gardening tools
- PE: Ball skills (rolling and receiving a ball, throwing and catching, dribbling with feet and kicking a ball)
- Fine motor activities: Dough disco, writing patterns, handy hands
- Working towards putting coat and water clothes on independently, including zip.

RE

- To the Ends of the Earth: Pentecost: the celebration of the Good News of Jesus
- Other Faiths: Islam Special Clothes

Literacy

- Listen to and join in with stories: Talking about books and naming the parts of a book
- Retell stories using props, pictures and story mountains: Jack and the Beanstalk
- Writing: Jack and the Beanstalk writing some letters accurately such as initial sounds
- Recognise and begin to write more letters in own name, progressing to all letters
- Develop phonological awareness: Phase 1 phonics

Mathematics


- Comparing height and length: Sunflowers and Caterpillars
- Patterns and shapes: Butterflies
- Time: Sequencing life-cycles and the events in 'Jack and the Beanstalk'
- Counting groups and recognising where there are more and fewer than
- Positional language


Understanding the World

- Role play: Outdoors Camping, Indoors- Caring for babies

Helping your child at home

We recommend that you share books and sing songs/nursery rhymes together at home every day. This is a wonderful opportunity to spend time together, as well as supporting your child with early communication, language and reading skills. Communicating with your child in your home language will provide a solid foundation for learning English.

We are taking part in the Brushing Buddies supervised toothbrushing programme. We recommend that **you** brush your child's teeth twice a day, also encouraging some independent tooth brushing.

Support your child with becoming increasingly independent with:

- dressing/undressing themselves
- managing personal hygiene (e.g. using the toilet, washing hands, brushing teeth)
- Putting on their own coat
- Using a knife and fork at meal times
