


History – Vikings

- Not all Vikings were warriors. Many came in peace and become farmers.
- Vikings were pagans and often raided monasteries. Lindisfarne raid was one of the first of their raids in 793 AD.
- The lands that the Vikings occupied were known as Danelaw.
- Long ships were designed to sail in both deep and shallow water so that they could get close to the shore and sail in rivers to get inland.
- As well as warriors, Vikings were skilled craftsmen and boat-builders, adventurous explorers and wide-ranging traders.

P.E. will take place on a **Thursday** and **Friday** and this half term will focus on volleyball and tag rugby. We ask children to come to school each Thursday and Friday in their PE kit instead of their school uniform.

Reading – It is important that your child continues to read at home and we are encouraging the children to do this for a little longer now they are reading much longer books so that they do not lose interest in their books. Fluency is key to understanding texts. If your child struggles with fluency, you can support fluency development by encouraging your child to re-read a paragraph to you 2-3 times.

Maths - Please also ensure your child is practising their times tables facts up to 12x12 and the related division facts that go with these e.g. $6 \times 3 = 18$ so $18 \div 6 = 3$. If you would like something to help with the practise of x tables facts, you can download the White Rose 1 Minute Maths app to any phone or tablet for FREE and all x tables have now been added to this. Encourage your child to go on this regularly but for a short amount of time and aim to beat their previous score. There are also many other maths facts that can be practised on here too!

Homework – Homework will be given out each Wednesday and will be collected the following Wednesday. Please encourage children to get into a good routine completing their work at a time that suits your family, and bring it in as soon as it is all completed. Encourage them to speak to us before it is due if they need any further support with it.
