








RE: Galilee to Jerusalem <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Retell the story of John the Baptist and the baptism of Jesus. Begin to recognise what a 'parable' and how Jesus uses them to teach people about God. Recognise that everyone is tempted to make bad choices (sin), but that God loves and forgives all people. Begin to recognise that the miracles of Jesus are signs that he is the Son of God. Correctly use religious words and phrases to recognise how Catholics say sorry to God in prayer and talk about why saying sorry to God and to others is important. 		
Geography: Where in the world is Nairobi? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To locate the 7 continents: Asia; Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Europe and Oceania To locate the 5 main oceans of the world: Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Southern and Arctic To know that Kenya is a country in Eastern Africa. To know that Nairobi is the capital city of Kenya, it is located in the highlands and is the largest and fastest growing city in Kenya. Science: Animals and Humans - Life Cycles <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To know that animals, including humans, have offspring that will grow into adults. To learn that the lifecycle of a frog has four stages - egg, tadpole, froglet and frog. To learn that the lifecycle of a chicken has four stages - egg, hatchling, chick and chicken. To learn that the lifecycle of a butterfly has four stages - egg, caterpillar, pupa and butterfly.

<p>Art: African Art – Edward Tingatinga</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Edward Tingatinga (1932-1972) was an African (Tanzanian) artist. Tingatinga art uses recycled, low-cost materials e.g. ceramic fragments, bicycle paint and Masonite squares (like MDF) Know that tertiary colours are made by mixing a primary and a secondary colour
